

Canada: Unauthorized products may pose serious health risks: Update

Health Canada is advising Canadians about unauthorized health products that may pose serious health risks. The table below is updated when Health Canada finds unauthorized health products that are promoted for sexual enhancement, weight loss, as a workout aid, or as “poppers”, and that are labelled to contain or have been tested and found to contain dangerous ingredients.

The unauthorized products added are:

Alien Power Platinum 11000 Sexual enhancement	Product with similar packaging (previously seized) was tested and found to contain tadalafil

Premium Pro Power 3500 Sexual enhancement	Labelled to contain yohimbe. Product with similar packaging (previously seized) was tested and found to contain sildenafil
