

Canada: Unauthorized workout supplements may pose serious health risks: Update

Health Canada is advising about unauthorized workout products that may pose serious health risks. The products are labelled to contain or have been tested and found to contain dangerous ingredients. Health Canada updates the table below when it finds unauthorized health products promoted as a workout aid.

The unauthorized products added are:

Consumers are advised to stop using these products and consult their healthcare professional if they have used these products and have health concerns.
